Leadership In Supervision: Creating Environment for Professional Growth (NFA F0646)

This 2-day course presents the supervisor with the basic leadership skills and tools needed to perform effectively in the fire and emergency medical services (EMS) environment. The course includes concepts related to a successful transition to a supervisory and leadership roles, including concepts of adaptive leadership; change management; active followership; effective communication, including difficult conversations and advocacy-inquiry-based dialogue; ethics; authority; power; decision-making; and active engagement through development of a personal plan.

Janie Gunnell has been a fire instructor for numerous years and contract instructor for the National Fire Academy for nearly 10 years. She is retired from Nassau County (FL) and the Florida State Fire College. She was President/Chief of Jacksonville Emergency Medical Auxiliary with Jacksonville Fire/Rescue.
